WELCOME to New College chapel. Music and worship have been at the heart of the college since 1379, when William of Wykeham founded the college for 'the increase of divine worship' as well as 'the growth of the Liberal Arts, Sciences and branches of learning'. Today chapel services gather students, staff and fellows to mark key moments in the academic year, and serve as a respite from the busy life of term. A few services are particularly for members of the college, but most are open to all, and all are welcome. This booklet includes the music for each service, and can be used alongside the Evensong card and Sung Eucharist booklet; but chapel services ask very little of those who come through the door, as the combined voices of the choir raise our pleas to God, and we are merely invited to be still in this place where prayer has been valid for many centuries. Whether you are a person of strong faith or none, a member of college or a first-time visitor, may you find peace and light in your time here.

THE Organist is always happy to hear of potential choristers in school years 1 and 2, and auditions all candidates for choristerships. Formal auditions take place in January for boys in year 2 for the choir's probationer programme, which starts in year 3. The Chorister Open Day in the summer provides an introduction to chorister life and to New College School, where choristers receive generous bursaries.

The Organist also welcomes contact with senior school musicians interested in applying for a choral award in New College. New College's own '**Experience Evensong**' programme offers young singers an opportunity to sing Evensong during University Term and to talk to choir staff and current choral scholars.

Sunday Evensong is followed by drinks in the Undercroft for students, staff and fellows of the college.

The Good Life is a series of conversations among New College fellows reflecting on what their research tells us about a life well-lived. This term Professor Kia Nobre and Dr Mark Stokes from the Oxford Centre for Human Brain Activity will be in conversation in the antechapel at 3.00 pm on Sunday 24 November, followed by tea in the Warden's lodgings.

Special Services this term include:

Freshers' Evensong to welcome all new students at 6.30 pm on Saturday 12 October.

The **College Commemoration Service** celebrating 40 years since the first women matriculated as students at New College is at 5.45 pm on Sunday 27 October. The Revd Professor Jane Shaw, Principal of Harris Manchester College and former Dean of Divinity of New College, will be preaching, and the service will feature music composed by women sung by New College Choir with the girl choristers of Frideswide Voices.

For the feast of **All Souls** the choir will sing Duruflé's Requiem and we will remember loved ones who have died. Please send names of any loved ones you would like to be remembered to the Chapel Administrator, Nancy-Jane Rucker (**nancy-jane.rucker@new.ox.ac.uk**).

THE CAROL SERVICES are on Sundays 1 and 8 December at 4.00 pm. There are very few tickets available for non-members of college and we are unable to accommodate outside groups.

There will also be **College Family Carols** on Wednesday 11 December at 4.30 pm, for staff, students and fellows of the college and their families only.

For students there will be a **Christmas Tree Decorating Party** at 4.00 pm on Tuesday 3 December, followed by a **Blessing of the Tree** at evensong.

Midnight Mass is at 11.00 pm on Christmas Eve. The music is sung by Collegium Novum Choir (not New College Choir). Students, staff and fellows of the college are invited to email the Dean of Divinity to reserve places for themselves and their guests for the service and for drinks afterwards in the Warden's lodgings.
